In Sufi dance we experience ecstasy and devotion. We sing songs and recitations from the Sufi tradition and let the music touch and move us. Like the spinning dervishes, we whirl around our hearts and invite the divine presence into our midst.



Through recitation, music, song and dance from the Sufi tradition, we enter into the consciousness of the dervishes. Deep devotion leads us on the path of the heart to the moment when we say: "Take this me and you from me until only you remain!" We experience the opening of our heart in the posture of the spinning dervishes by spreading our arms, giving wings to our heart and dancing!

We explore the steps on our path through the art of dreaming. There is an opportunity to share a current or past dream, which will be deepened in a meditative state. This allows to connect with inner guidance and experience development and healing.

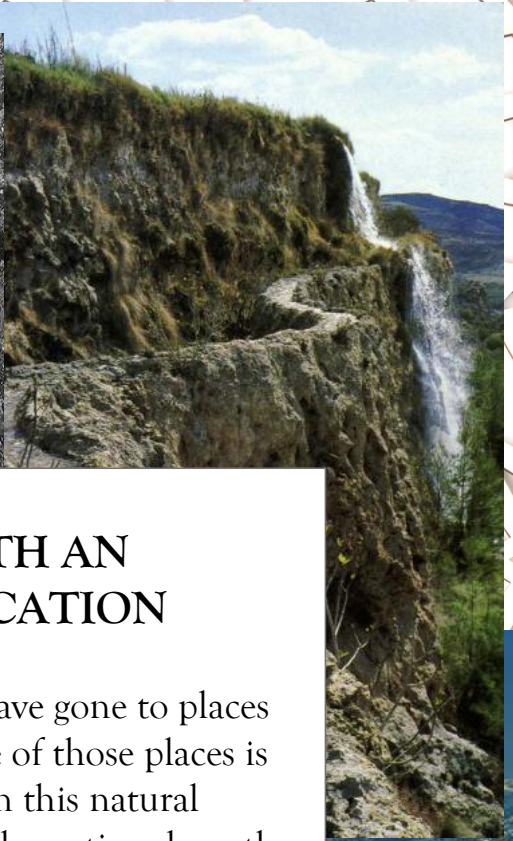
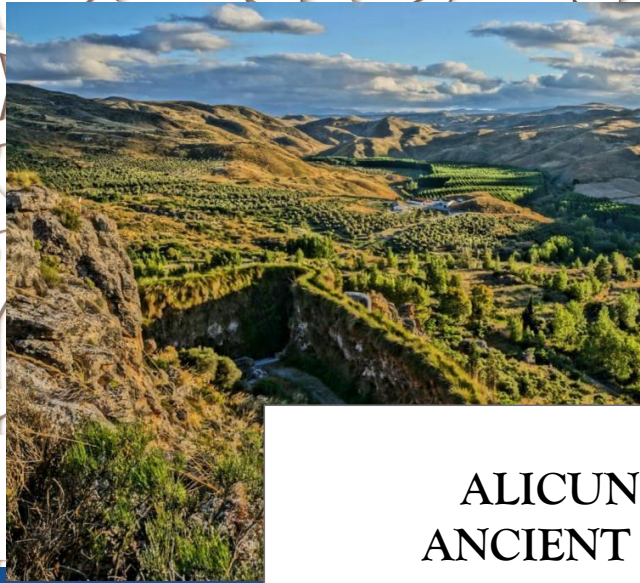


Fatimabi Monika Grieger

Fatimabi is the director and founder of the Sufi Centre Omega with its premises, the Khanqah Inayatiyya in the Swiss mountains and the Zawiya Sophia in Zurich. She is a murshida (authorised teacher) in the Inayatiyya Sufi tradition and a semazen (turning dervish) in the Mewlewi tradition.

She has been guiding people on their spiritual path for almost forty years. Her aim is to inspire them for life and the sacred in them. Fatimabi combines meditation with movement and song. This includes the spinning dance of the dervishes, which she has been teaching at various locations for many years.

Using the art of dreaming, spiritual dream work, she enables seekers to connect with their own inner guidance and the power of healing. The path she teaches is rooted in tradition and open to the future. It leads to a spirituality that involves body, heart and soul and deeply affirms life. Joy, happiness, ecstasy, as well as silence, devotion, contemplation and supreme meditation are all part of this path of spiritual freedom.

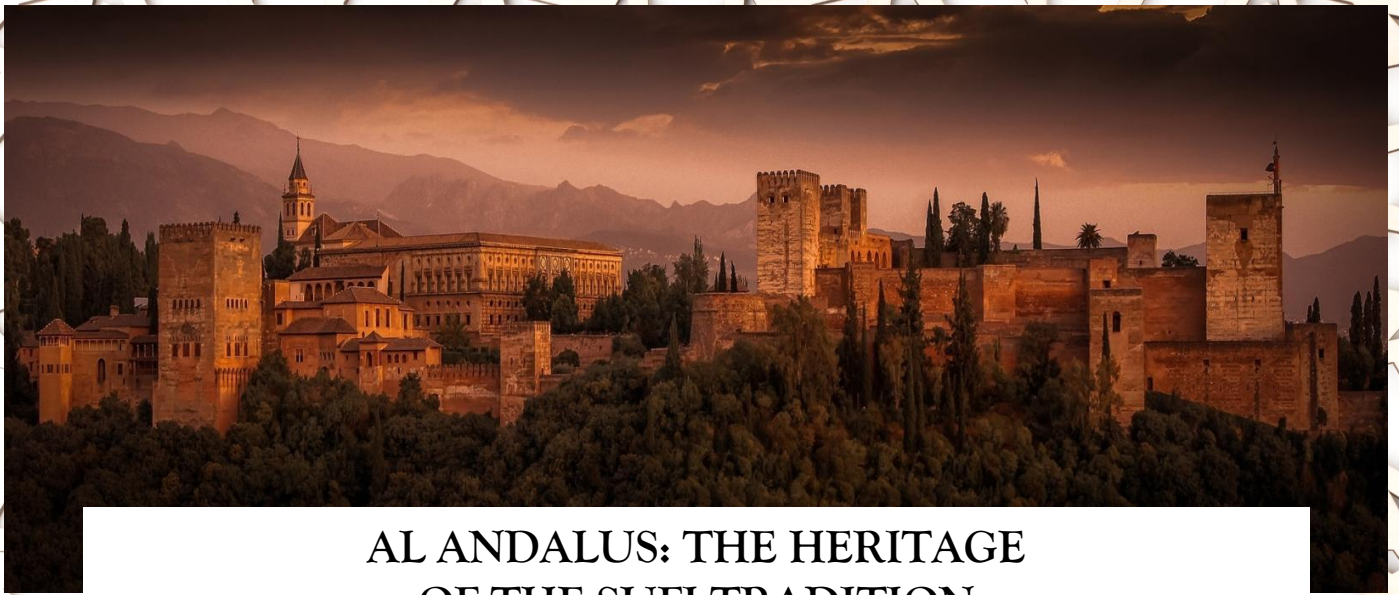


ALICUN: A PLACE WITH AN ANCIENT HEALING VOCATION

Since the dawn of time, human beings have gone to places where nature has the power to heal. One of those places is Alicún. The peace that is breathed in this natural environment, the mystery that permeates the entire place, the healing power of its thermal waters, the charm of its sunsets and starry nights, the extraordinary panoramic views of snowed peaks... all this makes a stay in this place healing in itself.

Its mineral-medicinal waters spring forth spontaneously and mark the healing character of the place. In its ancient flow, the waters have aligned themselves with the human being to create an amazing enclave, a challenge for the rational mind that fills the spirit with magic and mystery: the Toril and the plain of the hermitage.





AL ANDALUS: THE HERITAGE OF THE SUFI TRADITION

Alicun is located in the province of Granada, the last bastion of the Muslim kingdom of Al Andalus in Spain, an hour's drive from Granada city where the impressive Alhambra palace is located, and two and a half hours from Cordoba with its famous mosque.

In Al Andalus, Sufism was able to combine enlightenment and mysticism. The most famous poets of Al Andalus were also great Sufi masters, such as Ibn al-Arabi and many others. Here the three basic sources of knowledge converged: traditional teaching, scientific reason and mystical inspiration.

Statements on Sufism in relation to Al Andalus: «Sufis seek the hidden secrets of life; they long for a direct experience of God, whom they call the "Beloved." They do not see him as a stern teacher or an unattainable absolute, but as someone to be approached with perfect love... This fearless love of God made the Sufis dance, sing and party all night long. "Normal" people often considered them mad, but at the same time they were recognized as great artists, poets and mystics of Islam...».

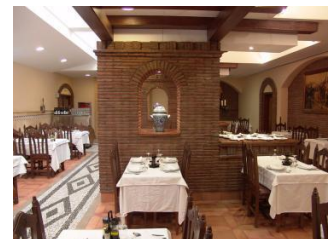
